National Professional Qualification for Headship (NPQH)

Our NPQH is a unique and integrated course which not only focuses on the key skills needed for headship but is also informed by both national and international theory and practice. It's a high bar that will challenge and develop talented leaders from all backgrounds to deliver educational excellence.

This is a unique programme being delivered in full partnership with the University of Nottingham's School of Education which could lead directly on to a MA in Educational Leadership and Management if you wish to continue your studies beyond NPQH.

National Professional Qualification for Senior Leadership (NPQSL)

The NPQSL is an established qualification that provides national recognition of your leadership development and professional achievement as a senior leader. It will support you in becoming a highly effective senior leader, with the skills, confidence and knowledge to contribute to the strategic development of your school or organisation as part of the senior leadership team.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP MIDDLE LEADERSHIP

National Professional Qualification for Middle Leadership (NPQML)

The NPQML is an established qualification that provides national recognition of your leadership development and professional achievement as a middle leader. It is designed to support participants in becoming highly effective middle leaders with the skills, confidence and knowledge to drive successful team performance and improved classroom practice.

Lincolnshire Teaching Schools Together (LTT) are proud to work with George Spencer Academy to deliver a Lincolnshire Cohort for the NPQH, NPQSL and NPQML.

Our programmes are delivered though a blended learning approach; a combination of face to face days, on-line learning, school experience, and self-directed study. As a competency based programme there is a focus throughout on the development of skills and understanding alongside leadership behaviours. Whilst on the programme day-to-day leadership development in your current school will allow you to:

- lead on a strategically challenging project
- engage in challenge and support from your coach and/or headteacher
- integrate new learning into your leadership practice
- develop those leadership behaviours identified through the 360 diagnostic
- negotiate and tackle specific whole team/school improvement priorities

Those not currently working in a school will undertake these activities in the school(s) that they have identified, and who have committed to support them. The course duration is 12 months with an expectation that participants go for final assessment within 12-18 months from induction. Participants have the opportunity to gain Masters credits towards the University of Nottingham's Masters in Educational Leadership and Management without extra charge or additional workload on the NPQ programmes.

PEER REVIEW

A peer review aims to provide external, objective and independent validation of a school's self-evaluation. LTSA will discuss your requirements with you and put together a peer review team with the appropriate expertise and skills to match your needs. The review will result in the identification of an aspect or aspects of the school's work that would benefit from becoming the subject of a Collaborative Enquiry. In this way the peer review process is directly linked with practical school improvement.

COLLABORATIVE ENQUIRY

Collaborative Enquiry clusters provide an opportunity for disciplined, focused innovation and development around an area of school improvement, in collaboration with other schools. The emphasis of this work is that it is collaborative and enquiring, underpinned by the recommendations in the EEFs Putting Evidence to Work Guidance Report. The basis of the cluster's work will depend on the priorities identified by the school's chosen method of external review.

HEADTEACHER PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT (HTPM)

LTSA has created its own rigorous process to support the professional development of headteachers. This provides governing bodies and headteachers with a clear methodology which maximises the potential for school improvement. A group of local headteachers has been trained in the use of this process. LTSA can also provide support in the commissioning and facilitation of HTPM.

Cost: LTSA Members £600

PUPIL PREMIUM REVIEW

LTSA has an experienced Pupil Premium Review team who have carried out reviews in a number of LTSA schools and beyond. We have a three-day model which involves preparation and report writing, as well as a five-day model which incorporates support with post-review action planning and evaluation of the impact of this action planning six months on.

Cost: LTSA Members 3 days £1350, 5 days £2250; Non-Alliance 3 days £1650, 5 days £2750

SCHOOL-TO-SCHOOL SUPPORT

LTSA manages the deployment of SLEs in a wide range of specialist areas. The system has been designed to ensure that schools can access support from experienced SLEs as well as enabling their skilled staff to have the experience of working with and supporting other schools. Changes to the system for 2019-20 will enable SLEs to become involved in a wider range of LTSA activities and ensure that they have the opportunity to be deployed. In preparation for the forthcoming academic year, schools will have the opportunity to meet and share their identified areas of support and expertise, aligning SLEs to the deployments available. Additional support can be commissioned throughout the year as required.

As well as supporting other schools, SLEs are also involved in designing and facilitating the subject specific offer and working more widely on other LTSA programmes. Several LTSA programmes are discounted for SLEs in order to support them continuing to develop their skill set (see pages 20-23).

Staff who are interested in becoming an SLE should speak to their Headteacher. Recruitment rounds take place throughout the year and all SLEs receive training before being accredited.

ROOTED IN READING

Rooted in Reading is a flexible reading for pleasure promotion programme. It encourages students of all ages, from pre-school to A-level, to read widely and then to spend a little time reflecting on what they have gained from their reading. 

Who is it for? The course is part of the Mentoring Practice Enhancement Programme offered by Sheffield Hallam University in partnership with Lincolnshire Teaching Schools Alliance (LTSA). The curriculum is mapped to the UK National Standards for school-based initial teacher training (ITT) mentors (2016). Professional recognition takes the form of digital 'Badges', awarded for successful tasks, and a certificate for completed participation. The tutor team includes school mentor trainers and university staff who specialise in teacher education.

What does it involve? The SHOOC opens online for registration on 1st October, 2019. Participants are given a Pebblepad account and access to all the materials and activities, including five workbooks, and work in their own time (approximately 25 hours in total), online, to complete the e-tivities (see over for more information).
