We are currently in the process of updating our website to reflect the new maths professional

As mentioned in previous articles we are mindful of the extraordinary circumstances schools and teachers find themselves in, and therefore programme commencement dates and mode of provision will be designed to reflect this. Opportunities will exist for teachers in all phases:

Early Years:

- Building Firm Mathematical Foundations in Reception
- Subject Knowledge for Teaching Mathematics

Primary:

- Mastery Readiness (bespoke support to enable TfM to be introduced in school)
- Teaching for Mastery Development Work Group (£1000 participation grant available to enable two teachers to attend half termly meetings and school support visits)
- Teaching for Mastery Sustaining Work Group (an opportunity to further develop teaching for mastery within school)
- Subject Knowledge for Teaching Mathematics (separate programmes for teachers and TA's)
- Year 5 to 8 Continuity Work Group

Secondary:

- Teaching for Mastery Development Work Group (£2000 participation grant per school)
- Year 5 to 8 Continuity Work Group
- Challenging Topics at GCSE Work Group

Level 3:

- Developing Core Maths Work Group
- Developing A Level Pedagogy Work Group
