REVIEW DAY PROVIDES A TEMPLATE FOR DEVELOPMENT

Over 30 people joined us for the Confident Choices Review Day on 18th September. The successes of last year were weighed against the new challenges presented by the impact of Covid-19 and by the desire to reach more schools and colleges with the benefits of careers collaboration.

SUPPORTING SCHOOLS

Schools were clear that priorities for this year were:

- Providing an alternative to work experience and other encounters with business
- Developing classroom friendly labour market information to support student confidence and aspiration
- Supporting school-to-school collaboration, especially when face to face meetings are difficult or impossible

We are responding to that with support for lead schools and with a planned resource library linked to suggested careers sessions.

EXTENDING THE FRAMEWORK

We still want to extend the framework to other settings to support all staff working in careers. Ambitiously, we not only want to see all Lincolnshire's mainstream schools and colleges within a local cluster, but also Special Schools and Alternative Provision being helped. If possible, we will begin to work with primary schools, identifying good practice and sharing that across the sector.

All this is summarised in a Milestones Document which will be available on the new Confident Choices website.

STUDENT RESOURCES

Based on feedback from schools, and as a specific response to the challenges of the pandemic, we are beginning to plan a series of resources that integrate classroom friendly LMI together with insights into employment sectors.

The programme will include support for employability skills with a clear mapping to the CDI framework and the Gatsby Benchmarks. Resources will be based around short, snappy videos and downloadable resources and will have a clear Lincolnshire focus.

There is much to be done before we have something ready, but we will keep you posted.
