Engagement Model training

An official training package from the Department for Education, The Engagement Model is a statutory assessment tool that helps schools meet their duties in supporting pupils who are working below the level of the national curriculum and who are not engaged in subject-specific study.

Learn Teaching School are running the training for the East Midlands, South Yorkshire and Humber region and **sessions are FREE**.

The training takes place in blocks of three twilights. The first set are running on 5^{th} Nov, 26^{th} Nov and 10^{th} Dec as twilights (2pm – 4pm).

English Curriculum Recovery Reading Recovery:

Session 1, "Strategies to Support the Development of Fluency", ran across 3 sessions to accommodate numbers leading to excellent feedback from participants and schools.

Session 2 aims to support schools with the teaching and learning of reading using a blended approach. We will explore how to structure and plan reading using a whole class approach with quality texts at the centre recognising that effective and expert teaching remains a high priority. Session 2 will run on 26.11.2020 at 12.30 to 1.30pm and 4 – 5pm.

Reading for Pupils with SEND:

These sessions will focus on pupils with SEND who may need alternative strategies for developing reading. We will look at scaffolding support and a range of resources which will support the learner. We will explore ICT to overcome reading barriers and allow inclusion in the mainstream and special school classroom.

Funded Wellbeing for Education Return CPD for all Lincolnshire Schools

All state funded schools and academies with children and young people aged 5-19 are invited to attend the DfE and Department of Health and Social Care Wellbeing for Education Return Training webinars. The training has been developed by the Anna Freud Centre for Children and Families and MindEd and adapted to meet local needs by a team of local mental health experts. Healthy Minds Lincolnshire will be the key point of contact for the coordination and delivery of the training along with partner organisations; Caring2Learn, the Working Together Team, BOSS, Mobilise and Kooth.

It is recommended that your school's designated Mental Health Lead, SENCO and a senior leader from your school (leadership attendance is essential if the SENCO role is not represented within the leadership team) attend both webinar 1 and 2. The two 90 minute webinars will be available from the 9th November 2020 until the 16th December 2020.

Aims:

- To support education staff to promote the mental health and wellbeing of the whole-school community
- To promote resilience and aid mental health recovery in light of the impact of COVID-19 and lockdown
 - Webinar 1 Whole-school approach to wellbeing and resilience
 - Webinar 2 Identifying concerns and supporting recovery in children and young people

- Your school will have the opportunity to apply for approximately £200 of funding to support the development of your whole-school approach to wellbeing (on submission of the evaluation form by the end of the Autumn term 2020)
- Certificates will be issued to all attendees
- Attendees will have the opportunity to attend follow-up interactive workshops from January 2021 which will be focused on support to implement key strategies from the training into practice
